I find business endlessly interesting - a fascinating mix of psychology, game theory and politics (the structure of human order).

I started my first business when I was seven making whole wheat bread. I processed the wheat berries into flour, kneaded, rose and baked it. I used all my mom's supplies and equipment, for which she charged me overhead so that I would understand that there's never a free lunch. I sold my loaves for \$2 each, and who knows if it was cause I was a kid, or because the bread was actually that good, but I sold that those loaves like bread



was going out of style. Eventually I had to close the business down because I just couldn't keep up with the demand and I think my mom was probably tired of every kitchen surface being covered in cooling bread. I made (what at the time seemed like) boatloads of money, I think I cleared something like \$250-300 dollars. As a seven year old that might as well have been a million dollars.

That short experience gave me a lifelong appreciation for and interest in business, especially small businesses. It's one of the things I feel most passionate about in this job because I believe that business will be the future of Lead's success. We are in a unique time and place here in this town. It'd be great to hitch our hopes and dreams to one big (or several big entities) but I think realistically the future lies in many smaller endeavors.

Starting a business takes a certain willingness to put a lot on the line, it takes guts! I so admire the people who have started businesses here in Lead and I hope to find ways to support and encourage them and people who are considering starting a business.
