
Why You Would Be a Good Fit

There are so many people who genuinely care and want to provide assistance. It's always good to know what programs, resources and help is available for those in our area.


GSC specifically seeks to provide high quality healthcare to residents of the Northern Hills, ages 19-64 who are uninsured and don't otherwise qualify for other healthcare assistance programs. Almost 50% of the GSC patients have serious chronic illnesses that if left untreated, would magnify their health care issues thus contributing to the even more siginificant costs to society and health care entities.

The GSC is a walk in clinic, and no appointment is necessary. They open Monday evening starting at 6pm. Proof of identity is required and no controlled substances of any kind are permitted on the church premises. Patients are seen on a need-priotity basis. Over 150 medical and non-medical volunteers at GSC are committed to the walk-in clinic's mission.
